Initially raised, with candidate list via email on 2017-02-01

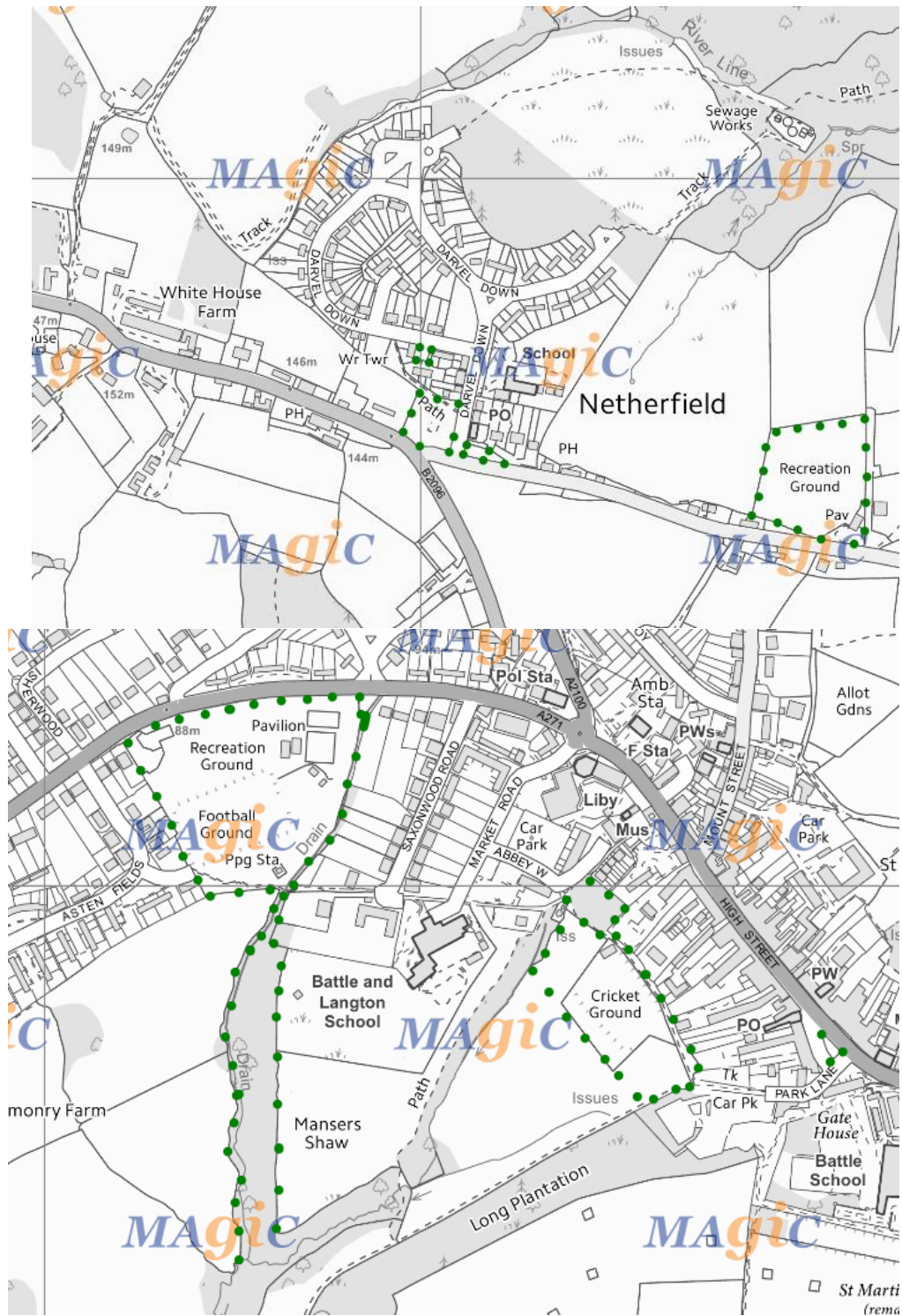
- a) Recreation Ground (children's play area), north off Coronation Gardens, Battle
- b) Recreation Grounds (children's play area & field to west of hall), Netherfield
- c) Recreation Ground, North Trade Road, Battle
- d) Recreation Ground (children's play area), south of Hastings Road, Telham
- e) Kingsmead Open Space, Caldbec Hill, Battle
- f) Cricket Ground, off Park Lane, Battle
- g) NT land at Upper Lake/Marley Lane, Battle
- h) Any remaining undedicated land at Town Cemetery, off Marley Lane, Battle

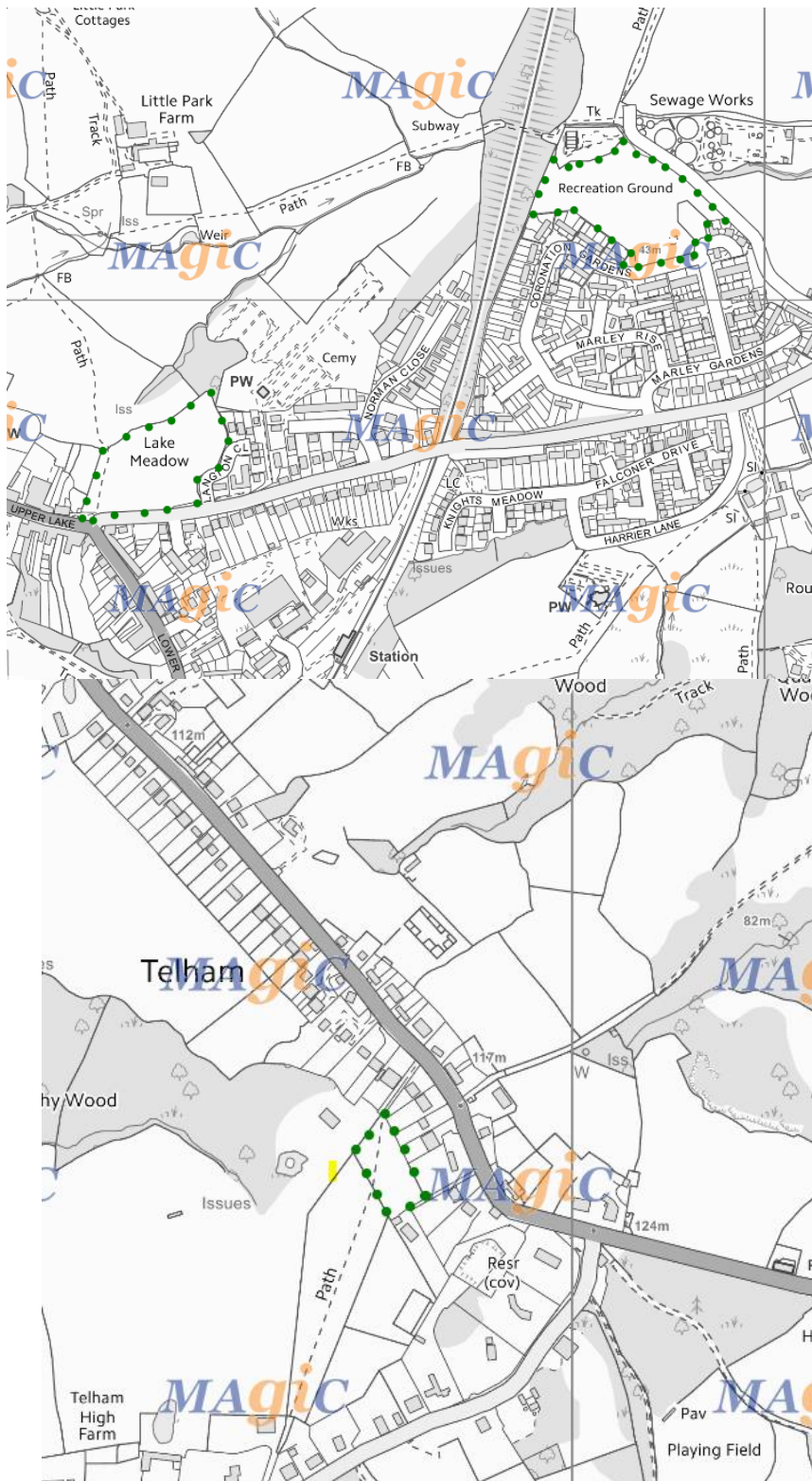
These are all focussed on Green spaces and ACV classification may not always be the best categorisation to protect them – an expert view is required to make a determination about ACV, Common Land, Village Green etc.

The list has been slightly enhanced since the original proposal and is now better and more precisely described. It is represented in this document now listed (north-west to south-east) and to be progressed:
