

## **The Built Environment**

### **The buildings and built over land identified below are considered to contribute to the character of Battle and/or provide a valuable community service**

Many of those listed below already have some protection from development by inclusion on the National Heritage List for England (NHLE) and other legal protections but are included here to give a holistic overview. Other buildings without protection, and some are not particularly old or of historic or architectural merit, are included as they add to the character of the town or provide a community service:

1. Buildings in Lower Lake from Powdermill Lane junction with Lower Lake from number 22 after Piccardy Close up to Upper Lake on the east side and on west side from junction up to Chequers Pub
2. All buildings in the High Street and Upper Lake including:
3. Memorial Hall
4. Battle Library
5. Youth Centre/Teachers Centre
6. Land in front of Youth Centre/Teachers Centre Battle High Street – currently used as a skate board ramp
7. White Hart Pub Netherfield
8. Netherfield Arms Netherfield
9. The Post Office and village shop in Netherfield
10. Village Hall Netherfield
11. Marley Stores Coronation Gardens Marley Lane
12. Blackhorse Pub Telham
13. The Emmanuel Centre Harrow Lane off Marley Lane
14. St Marys Church Halls
15. Pavilion on North Trade Road recreation ground
16. Bowls Club and Bowling Green Senlac Public House
17. Band stand and Market Square

18. All buildings in Mount Street including:
19. Battle Baptist Church Hall on west side Mount Street up to number 21 one past the old court house
20. Corner of high St and Mount Street on east side up to Lewinscroft and Edric and properties behind.
21. Abbey Green
22. The old Police Station and Courthouse
23. The Railway Station
24. Fire station and grounds
25. Mount Street Car Parks
26. Market Road Car Parks
