Lack of 'alternative' local road routes to circumvent Battle Town centre Roads through Battle town centre used as alternative to A21 etc. Unattractive town centre due to narrow footpaths & heavy through traffic, e.g. no pedestrian 'precinct' and alfresco cafe areas. Claverham Secondary and Battle & Langton schools at full capacity Lack of <u>local</u> facilities for young people Poor public transport Poor communications including broadband & mobile devices signals Inadequate & overburdened services infrastructure, (electric, gas, water, sewage), particularly in outlying districts, (Netherfield & Telham) Expensive parking for regular short term visits Large delivery Lorries in Battle High Street at 'peak' traffic times. Lack of available land for 'sympathetic' housing/offices development. Abbey Green not being used to full potential Lack of modern community centre/health facilities within close, safe and easy access for Netherfield residents. Many countryside walks unmaintained, badly signposted/advertised, and virtually impassable. Lack of prompt attendance by emergency services.
