It is hoped that the list can be incorporated in the Neighbourhood Plan. A local heritage list is designed to give protection to those properties that are not listed by Historic England. It can help to inform planning decisions in a way that conserves and enhances local character and identity. Under the National Planning Policy Framework, the Government's planning policies for England, the conservation and contribution of locally listed heritage assets is a material consideration in planning decisions that directly affect them, or their setting.
