any of you were worried about the lack of infrastructure that Battle has now and how it will cope with new housing targets by the Government. So I have explained here how Battle will benefit by deciding where we think the money should and needs to be spent. But only if we can adopt our own neighbourhood plan.

Some months ago I wrote about the Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) which is a planning charge, paid by developers on dwellings and which came into force in 2010.

The total CIL charges will be: £2,375,200
Battle's Share without neighbourhood
plan of 15%£356,2800: this will be our share
if we had a "no" vote in the referendum

Battle's Share with neighbourhood plan of 25% £593,800: this will be our share if the majority of voters who take part in the referendum vote for the plan. Just imagine how nearly £600,000 could benefit Battle!

You will have seen last week in the Bexhill and Battle Observer about the renewal of the Skate Ramp. We know how much this facility is valued by the young of the town, and how disappointed they are by its present, unusable state. It is likely that Battle Town Council could use the CIL moneys to go some way towards replacing this vital structure. So, all of you out there who remember what it was like skate, please vote to adopt the Neighbourhood Plan! You will be forever remembered by the youth of the town!
